Proverbs 29:11 (ESV)

A fool gives full vent to his spirit, but a wise man quietly holds it back.



Areas to consider | Fame

Proverbs 25:27 (ESV)

It is not good to eat much honey, nor is it glorious to seek one's own glory.



Areas to consider | Food

Proverbs 25:16 (ESV)

If you have found *honey*, eat only enough for you, lest you have your fill of it and *vomit* it.

We have a tendency to turn Honey to Vomit



Areas to consider | Anger

Proverbs 14:29 (ESV)

Whoever is slow to anger has great understanding, but he who has a hasty temper exalts folly.



Areas to consider | Anger

Proverbs 15:18 (ESV)

A hot-tempered man stirs up strife, but he who is *slow to anger* quiets contention.

"Quarrels depend on people far more than subject-matter" -Kidner

Areas to consider | Anger

Proverbs 16:32 (ESV)

Whoever is *slow to anger* is better than the mighty, and he who rules his spirit than he who takes a city.

Psalm 37:4 (ESV)

Delight yourself in the Lord and he will give you the desires of your heart.

- Devour God's Word



Psalm 19:10 (ESV)

More to be desired are they [God's Word] than gold, even much fine gold; sweeter also than honey and drippings of the honeycomb.

Psalm 119:103 (ESV)

How sweet are your words to my taste, sweeter than *honey* to my mouth!



How to cultivate self-control

- Get better desires
- Devour God's Word
- Embrace Christ and live by the Spirit



Galatians 5:24 (ESV)

And those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires.



To sow to the flesh, is to pander to it, to cosset, cuddle and store it, instead of crucifying it...Every time we allow our mind to harbor a grudge, nurse a grievance, entertain an impure fantasy, or wallow in self-pity, we are sowing to the flesh. Every time we linger in bad company whose insidious influence we know we cannot resist, every time we lie in bed when we

ought to be up and praying, every time we read pornographic literature, every time we take a risk which strains our self-control, we are sowing, sowing to the flesh. Some Christians sow to the flesh every day and wonder why they do not reap holiness.
