In response to John 16:25-33

Lord, lately it seems that no matter where we turn, we are inundated with voices that amplify our fears. Some of us fear for our health, or the health of a loved one. Some of us are afraid that things will never go back to "normal." Some of us have feared for our own safety. Many of us, when we look deeper within, will find a fear that things are spinning beyond our control. We might even feel a deep-seated fear that there is just no way you could ever forgive us for falling into that sin that clings so closely once again.

And yet, when we see you on the night you were betrayed, even as you prepared to go to the cross and die, we find that your concern was that your followers would find peace. When it seemed very much like things were not as they should be, you knew that you were right where you were supposed to be. Nothing that night was beyond your control, because you hold all creation together. And what was true on that darkest of nights is no less true today.
