# **A Desperate Dad**


## **Mark 5:24b-29 (ESV)**

**but rather grew worse. <sup>27</sup> She had heard the reports about Jesus and came up behind him in the crowd and touched his garment. <sup>28</sup> For she said, “If I touch even his garments, I will be made well.” <sup>29</sup> And immediately the flow of blood dried up,**

healed of her disease.**




# **A Silent Sufferer**

**<sup>30</sup> And Jesus, perceiving in himself that power had gone out from him, immediately turned about in the crowd and said, “Who touched my garments?” <sup>31</sup> And his disciples said to him, “You see the crowd pressing around you, and yet you**

# **A Dead Daughter**

## **Mark 5:36-40a (ESV)**

**<sup>36</sup> But overhearing what they said, Jesus said to the ruler of the synagogue, “Do not fear, only believe.” <sup>37</sup> And he allowed no one to follow him except Peter and James and John the brother of James. <sup>38</sup> They came to the house of the ruler of the**

## **Mark 5:36-40a (ESV)**

**synagogue, and Jesus saw a commotion, people weeping and wailing loudly.<sup>39</sup> And when he had entered, he said to them, “Why are you making a commotion and weeping? The child is not dead but sleeping.”<sup>40a</sup> And they laughed at him.**



## **Mark 5:40b-43 (ESV)**

**40b But he put them all outside and took the child's father and mother and those who were with him and went in where the child was. <sup>41</sup> Taking her by the hand he said to her, "Talitha cumi," which means, "Little girl, I say to you, arise." <sup>42</sup> And immediately**

## **Mark 5:40b-43 (ESV)**

**the girl got up and began walking (for she was twelve years of age), and they were immediately overcome with amazement.**

**<sup>43</sup> And he strictly charged them that no one should know this, and told them to give her something to eat.**
